## Where have all our geese gone?

here was a time not too many years ago when it wasn't unusual to see and hear geese coming and going from their native Canadian land. Limestone County was a hotspot landing for the big birds.

But, not any more. The few Canadians we have today are more like tame birds that prefer to stay around the pond on the farm.

Many around here still remember the days when the Wheeler National Wildlife Refuge was home to tens of thousands of the honkers visiting annually from Canada. It was really something to see as they flew in and out of the refuge. Goose hunting was also popular, especially in the southern portion of the county.

But you know, time changes just about everything in one way or the other, including birds. Now, instead of geese, we have cranes and a bunch of them.

The celebration of Sandhill Cranes and Whooping Cranes brought together experienced birders and those who would like to learn more about birding and other wildlife that call the refuge home.

More than 12,000 Sandhill Cranes along with several pairs of Whooping Cranes spend the winter each year at the refuge.

A couple of years ago they said the Whooping Crane was on the

verge of a comeback after nearly becoming extinct due to human activities. In 1941, the last migratory flock was reduced to only 16 birds.

Now, don't get me wrong, I guess it's nice to see all those cranes, but I miss the days of old hearing the geese flying in from the north,

and hearing many of the old timers around here say the geese visit meant a big change in the weather wasn't too far away.

We don't have that many geese here now, but we've got plenty of cranes for you to see. As a matter of fact, they say the refuge supports the state's largest concentration of Sandhill Cranes. The Wheeler National Wildlife Refuge Visitor Center is located at 3121 Visitor Center Road in Decatur just off Highway 67, covering 35,000 acres. Like the days of yesteryear, you can see a lot of birds there, more cranes than ducks and geese, but a lot of birds.


## **Snowfall blankets the holler**

he winter weather turned cold just after Christmas back in 1942. The war was raging in Europe, and our only exposure to the news was through radio broadcast. Newspapers were scarce, and very few made it to the holler. Weather forecasts were non-existent, and the only weather instrument we had was a Bull-Durham temperature gage.

Snows that fell during the night were always a big surprise in the morning when we awoke. The day before the big snow was sunny and fairly warm. Grandma Minnie made the comment, "It sure is warm for it to be January."

She could look at the sky and tell when a major weather change was on the way. High, thin clouds she referred to as mare tails, were a sign the weather was changing in the next 48 hours. Grandma said, "You boys need to make sure we've got plenty of split firewood in the shed because it could snow in a day or two."

Humpy would never talk back to grandma, but under his breath he would whisper, "She always wants us to do something." Dalton would grin and say, "She usually knows what she is talking about." Another tell tale sign was her arthritis. I heard grandma say,



"My old hands are hurting. The of forecasting weather until she weather's going to change."

We all turned in and had a good fire burning in the wood heater. The temperature fell during the night, and I awoke very cold. By 3 o'clock in the morning the fire had usually burned out. I went to the closet in search of another quilt and glanced out the window and saw the snow covering the ground.

The snow was still falling, and the house was as cold as ice. I woke Dalton and told him about the snow. He jumped up and went to the window and was speechless. Dalton said, "Grandma said it might snow. " She had the gift sharp curve at the bottom. We

passed.

Humpy built a fire and had the house warm by the time grandma got up to start breakfast. She laughed out loud and said, "You boys see that snow?" We answered, "Yes ma'am." in a humbling tone. After breakfast we fed the stock and went to the hills for some sliding. An old car hood was the perfect sled for racing down the hill side in the fresh snow.

Humpy said, "Let's take a ride down the hill on the old roadbed." This was a dangerous hill with a

piled on the sheet of metal and down the hill we raced. We were getting faster and faster with the curve coming into view. I rolled off backwards before we got to the curve. Humpy and Dalton stayed on the homemade snow sled. When the duo came into the curve, it was the last I could see of them. The sled and boys went 10 or 12 feet in the air and crashed into a deep ditch.

As I made my way to where the crash happened, I could hear Dalton screaming, "My wrist is broken!" I reached the boys, and Humpy was OK, but poor Dalton had a dislocated wrist.

The mail carrier was running his route and stopped to help out. He volunteered to drive Dalton over to Bethel to see the doctor. Folks were good to help out in time of need. Our mail carrier had chains on his tires, and his car was the only way Dalton could have got medical attention on that snowy

The rest of the winter was pretty cold, and we burned down our firewood pile pretty low by spring. Dalton's wrist healed up, and we still laugh about the day our runaway car hood almost killed us





## Festival of the Cranes Jan. 12-14



ver 14,000 Sandhill Cranes along with several pairs of Whooping Cranes spend the winter each year at Wheeler National Wildlife Refuge (WNWR) in Decatur, Ala. In celebration of the winter migration of these long-legged and long-necked birds, Wheeler Wildlife Refuge Association hosts a three-day event offering a variety of indoor and outdoor activities appealing to people of all ages. The 2024 Festival of the Cranes will be held January 12-14 with activities at WNWR and at The Princess Theatre and Alabama Center for the Arts in downtown Decatur.

Festival of the Cranes has become a popular event regardless of the festivalgoer's birding experience. There are activities for experienced birders, for those with little to no birding knowledge and for anyone who would like to learn more about birding and other wildlife that call

the Refuge home. During the three-day event, guests are invited to visit the WNWR Observation Building to view thousands of Sandhill cranes along with several Whooping cranes, ducks, geese, raptors and perhaps a bald eagle from the comfort of the heated building. There are bleachers and spotting scopes available along with volunteers and staff standing by to answer questions. Festivalgoers are encouraged to bring a camera and binoculars.


Additional activities scheduled at WNWR include an introduction to birding, outdoor morning and afternoon walks around the visitor center grounds to see cranes and other waterfowl in their natural habitat and photography workshops.

The Princess Theatre and Alabama Center for the Arts are also offering special events in conjunction with Festival of the Cranes. The schedule of events includes special activities for children, live bats, raptors, reptiles and amphibians shows, latest news on crane conservation and much more.

## Catfishing on the Tennesse River

old weather didn't keep Spencer Blake and his Great-Granddad, Nixon, from fishing near the Nuclear Plant back in December. Spencer said that was a good day to fish with just a little wind.

He had only caught one fish that day before landing the 'Big' one. He was fishing with chicken for his bait and caught a big Blue Cat that weighed approximately 50 lbs. What a surprise! It turned out to be a good fishing day for Spencer.

The Tennessee River is known for its big smallmouth bass and blue catfish. Blue catfish live nine to 10 years on average, though some have been known to live up to 25 years. An adult blue catfish can weigh over 100 lbs. but the World Record blue catfish: 143 pounds caught in Kerr Lake in 2011.

Wheeler Lake has become known as one of the best catfish lakes in the Southeast. Blue, channel and flathead catfish can be caught out of Wheeler. My favorite bait for catfish is skip jack heads. It's hard for a big cat to pass up a smelly, juicy skip jack. Salt water equipment is recommended to use fishing for giant catfish and heavy line.

A fisherman can only keep one fish over 31 inches per day in their possession. It a shame to kill a giant catfish for food. 1 to 2 pounders are the best for eating.

Rumor has it divers who work in the deep water above the dams see large catfish that makes them uncomfortable to be around. The 360 electronic is a hand tool for seeing the big fish stacked up on the bottom.

The catfish look like long white objects near the lake bottom. Catfish set up below current breaks waiting on their next meal to wash by. In May, catfish move

into rocky banks to spawn. The up river bank on the northside of the river at Lucy Branch has been a good catfish bank.

My granddad introduced me to catfishing on Shoal Creek near Red Hill. My hook was made out of a safety pin. The fishing pole was a cane cut off the bank. Kite was use for fishing line. I remember it like it was yesterday. The catfish put up a good fight, but I landed it - a 3 pound yellow catfish. Papa always was kidding around and would ask people if they had ever seen a 'cat' fish. The answer was always yes. Then he would follow up with, "How did he hold the pole?" I loved that ole man, and he was a good role model.

## **Getting the Correct Response**

ave you ever watched a horse do some pretty awesome stuff for its handler? I'm not talking about things like circus tricks and such. I'm talking about things you think you can do.

Ever wonder how these horses are taught to do these things?

Teaching horses does take time, but the primary element is conditioned response.

Conditioning is a process where the behavior response becomes increasingly consistent as a result of reinforcement. Reinforcement occurs following the response to a stimulus. Reinforcement can be comfortable or uncomfortable. The comfort or discomfort can be physical or psychological (emotional).

With horses, physical discomfort includes annoying stimuli such as prodding, tapping or poking. Physical comfort, of course, is as water, food, shelter, rest, and grooming (stroking).

Psychological comfort includes, soothing sounds, pleasantness, and the absence of angered impatience.

Psychological discomfort is fear, (usually from anger and impatience from the human). It also exists where there may be



impending physical discomfort.

A horse has fear (a psychological discomfort) because it is fearful of pain (a physical discomfort).

Every horse is different; we have to choose our method of teaching a horse carefully. We have to understand the horse, read the horse and determining if the horse is a right brained horse of a left brained horse. Right brained horse is a very fearful horse, a horse that wants to get away,

an unconfident a horse that is unteachable until it is more left brained.


The left brained horse is the confident horse, the teachable

- 1 (1.25 ounce) package beef with onion soup mix Salt and pepper to taste


#### **Directions**

# Classic Automobiles 1949 Mercury Coupe



If you've seen the movie "Cobra," starring Sylvester Stallone as a cop who loves to blow away everything and everyone, you've probably noticed the other star of the movie, a 1949 Mercury Sports Coupe. That this coupe - and other members of the Merc 9CM line appeared at all in 1949 - is thanks to the intense lobbying of Henry Ford's Uncle Edsel who saw the need for a division to compete

with General Motors mid-range. Ford Motor didn't even come close to having any mid-range competitive edge as it had the base Ford and high-end Lincoln Divisions and nothing in between. To Edsel, it was obvious, the automaker needed another competitive divi-

The 1949 Mercury Division whose products were marketed as Fords with different names and a little upgrade - was actually the savior of the automaker as its Sport Coupe (Cobra's futuristic - for the time - vehicle) brought buyers back in the mid-price

Suffice it to say, Mercury did have a full line, a convertible, two-door hardtop, conventional sedan and conventional coupe and suffice it further than they all did well. However, it's the Sports Coupe that people remember.

Powered by Ford's flathead V-8, the engine was bored and stroked to where it cranked out 255 horsepower for the Sport Coupe, which was about as much as you'll get from any vehicle whose V-8 engine only runs with roughly a 6.8-to-one compression ratio. It could be mated to a three-speed manual or an automatic.




